#### A NOTE FROM KAHU AKANA

#### And Who Is My Neighbor?

Dear Members and Friends of Kōloa Union Church:

These past few weeks, we have been asking the question, "And who is my neighbor?" This is not a new question for us. In fact, our spiritual ancestors began asking that question in 1835 when our congregation was first established; and, with each new group of people arriving on the south shore of Kaua`i, we have been asking that question ever since. There have always been neighbors with needs that our church has addressed. As we begin to look to the new year, plan priorities and budgets, I cannot think of a better thing on which to focus.

There are many needs on our island and I know that we cannot address them all with our full attention. Therefore, I ask you to join me in this time of discernment. I invite you to open your eyes and see where the greatest needs might be; to open your ears and hear where the cries come from the deepest places of the soul; to open your hearts and sense where God's Spirit is stirring in them.

This time of discerning will culminate (though certainly not end!) on November 6. On that day, we will create a banner of hearts; on each heart will be a word or phrase listing or describing a kind of neighbor or group of neighbors who have needs in our community. I invite everyone to write down on a paper heart (provided for you!) the kind of neighbor with a deep need and bring your heart to church on or before November 6. Our members and regular attendees should have already received a heart by now. If you have not received one, please contact

Penny at the church office and ask for yours. By participating in this project, you will help us create a beautiful banner of all the people with whom we wish to share our aloha.

On November 6, we will also have our annual "Blessing of Commitments" during the worship service. This is an important practice that we do each fall in order to seek God's blessing as we plan our mission and help our Church Council plan our budget beginning in January. I encourage every member and friend of Kōloa Union Church to support our vision to reach out to our neighbors by filling out a commitment card and bringing it to church on or before the 6<sup>th</sup>. Please contact Penny if you would like a commitment card mailed to you.

As we continue this time of prayer and discernment, I invite you to keep on praying this prayer:

O God, as we seek to reach out into our community

by sharing aloha with everyone in the coming year, open my heart

so that love will freely flow in and out of it.

May the commitment I make truly represent
the gratitude

I have to you for all that Kōloa Union Church means to me.

November 20: Thanksgiving Sunday


Come to church prepared to share the things that you are most thankful for in life.






church with us. The front lawn has grown so quickly. We have already opened it up for special parking. **Palani** and friends ar-
