A NOTE FROM KAHU AKANA

Happy New Year: Celebrate & Anticipate!Dear Members and Friends of Kōloa Union
Church:

As 2016 comes to a close and a new year begins, there is much to celebrate and a lot to anticipate! In addition to getting on top of our finances, we have had a tremendously successful year with our capital campaign projects, including our new parking lot, landscaping, signage and outdoor lighting, photovoltaic solar panels, beautiful koa furnishings, and newly painted buildings. Our facilities are looking fantastic and all of our projects were paid for with cash on hand! In 2017, we plan to install our irrigation system and complete our landscaping; install tinting and special designs on some of the windows; create a foyer and enclose additional space in the sanctuary; create cabinet space for worship materials and items for the Deacons; and add more seating in the sanctuary. We will also begin our plans for making a nice women's restroom and make some upgrades to the men's restroom, as well as for expanding the office area. The capital campaign also gave \$5,000 to our permanent funds and \$1,000 to our youth funds (part of the initial capital campaign plans).

I am also happy to announce that Kathleen Dahill is now our permanent Music Director! Kathleen met with the Board of Deacons in December after her 3-month probation period, which was part of her contract when she was hired. They affirmed her for working so well with our church choir, bringing new music to our worship services, being a voice coach to choir members and others, her work with children and youth, and for sharing her talent with us! I am so pleased with the new music, positive energy and ways to celebrate God's presence among us that Kathleen brings to us!

Another highlight worth mentioning is the increase in activity among the children and youth. Under the guidance of Tiffany Marrotte, our Sunday School Superintendent and Youth Coordinator, we have seen a lot more children and teenagers showing up and participating in the life of the church. The people of Koloa Union Church have been welcoming and encouraging of our young people and their families, and I look forward to seeing even more of this trend in the coming year!

A final highlight for me has been the significant increase in the service to the community, under the guidance of Judyth Foley, our Outreach Chairperson. We have been feeding people over the holidays and bringing joy to children and families who don't have the financial blessings that many of us enjoy. We have fed families and delivered gifts to children. I am so impressed by our congregation's generosity to struggling families on the south shore! I am also looking forward to the new ways in which God's Spirit leads us in sharing aloha with everyone!

on our altar table. **Pat & Larry** are on a cruise going to the Panama Canal!!! Look who just turned ONE...precious **Kairi**!!!


