A NOTE FROM KAHU AKANA

SOMETHING TO CHEW ON FOR A WHILE

Dear Members and Friends of Kōloa Union Church:

I want to express my appreciation to each person who showed up to our summer book group, which concluded on July 19. We gathered on Wednesday evenings for a meal and discussion of Marcus Borg's book Convictions: How I Learned What Matters Most. In the book, Borg wrote about some of his heartfelt convictions regarding faith, religious experience, politics, and other matters. What I enjoyed most about the group was learning how parts of Borg's book landed on readers-sometimes in a very positive and inspirational way, and at other times in an uncomfortable way. I particularly enjoyed the compassionate and understanding responses from others in the group when someone disagreed with the author or found his thoughts and ideas a bit of a stretch from their comfort zones.

I have observed such responses at other times and places at Kōloa Union Church—particularly after sermons. On several occasions people have said things to me like, "I really enjoyed your sermon today. I don't think I agree with you on everything, but you gave me something to chew on for awhile." I am grateful for the opportunity to share with people every week my understanding of the Christian faith, interpreta-

tions of our Scriptures, and convictions of what kind of people and community God is calling us to be in the 21st century. I am also very thankful for the compassionate and understanding attitude of people who may disagree with me or see things through different lenses.

My intention and commitment is to share my understanding, interpretations convictions through sermons, prayers, book groups and conversations, and also to listen to each of you with the same attitude which I so often observe among the people of Kōloa Union Church—that I can learn and grow in my faith, and find new things to chew on for awhile. When describing our church to others, I often tell people that the church is an accepting place where people can come from all kinds of different backgrounds and worldviews and know they will be welcome here among us. It is also a church where people appreciate having something to chew on for awhile.

We are happy to announce that we have received a \$40,000 grant from the Vidinha Charitable Trust, which will allow us to begin our sanctuary expansion project this summer! We will enclose the area where the pews are located, as well as the space where welcome cards, bulletins and books are kept on the portable table on Sunday mornings. We will also remove the large moveable walls and lattice fence and gate, and add new entry doors, sliding glass doors and windows. Furthermore, we will remove the strip of carpet which runs the length of the sanctuary and fix the uneven places on the floor. We plan to complete the project in the fall.
