A NOTE FROM KAHU AKANA Changing Lives, Transforming the World in 2018!

Dear Members and Friends of Koloa Union Church:

On Sunday mornings, we have been sharing stories about how Koloa Union Church has changed lives and been an important part of transforming communities here on Kaua'i and throughout the world. This past Sunday, Debbie Gunning, the Chair of our Stewardship Committee, talked about how important our church has been to her and what a difference it has meant to her personally; she also talked about the huge difference our church makes in our 5-for-5 offerings to the United Church of Christ. Koloa Union Church has committed \$5,000 to the basic support of Our Church's Wider Mission in 2017, which comes directly out of our budget. 50% of the basic support stays within Hawai'i to support the mission of the UCC here in the islands, and 50% goes to the national church in order to support the UCC mission throughout the world.

The other 4 offerings are collected separately throughout the year. The next one will be the Neighbors in Need special mission offering, which we will collect on Sunday, November 5. The funds we collect support ministries of justice and compassion throughout the U.S. One-third of the offering goes directly to support Native American ministry and the other two-thirds support ministries of justice, including grants to churches which are creating new ways to make the world a better place.

In order to support the important work of the United Church of Christ worldwide, the Hawai'i Conference, the Kaua'i Association, and Koloa Union Church, I invite you to prayerfully consider what you might commit to contributing to our church's general fund in 2018. Commitment cards were recently mailed to our members and those who regularly make financial gifts to our church. Please bring your card with you to church on Sunday, October 1, for the blessing of our commitments. We will also celebrate World Communion Sunday on that day, as we remind ourselves of Christians all over the world who serve God by following Jesus, and the many ways we all make a difference by doing so! If you cannot make it on the 1st, please send your card in ahead of time so that we can include it in our blessing. If you didn't get a commitment card, we have plenty more at the church and will have them available on October 1. Your card makes a huge difference to me and the Church Council as we create a budget for the upcoming year!

Thank you for your generosity so far. We make such a difference in our community and world already. As you decide what you wish to contribute in 2018, please prayerfully consider a generous financial commitment that truly represents the gratitude you have for Kōloa Union Church and the many ways we change lives and transform the world! Our prayer for 2018 is on page 2; please pray those words as you decide your support for next year. I am looking forward to seeing how God leads us in the year ahead!




500th Anniversary Celebration
