A NOTE FROM KAHU AKANA GOOD NEWS FOR THE NEW YEAR

Dear Members and Friends of Koloa Union Church:

As 2017 comes to a close and the new year begins, there is a lot of good news! We had another good year of generous donations to our general fund, Our Churches Wider Mission, and local outreach in the community. We also have had a tremendously successful year with our capital campaign projects, including our irrigation system, outdoor lighting, and the new tinting and special designs on the sanctuary windows. We also began our sanctuary expansion project! In the first few weeks of January, our new foyer will be done, including two new beautiful koa entry doors (in memory of Tony and Phyllis Kunimura), a Deacon's cabinet and countertop, an area for nametags, and new sliding doors. Once all of this is done, the area will be painted, the floor will be textured and stained, and we will add some lighting. Our facilities and grounds are looking more fantastic and all of our projects were paid for with cash on hand! We have also begun our plans for making a nice women's restroom and upgrades to the men's restroom, as well as for expanding the office area. The capital campaign also gave \$5,000 to our permanent funds and \$2,000 to our youth funds (part of the initial capital campaign plans). Thanks so much to everyone who has given so generously, and another extra-special thanks to Dan Giovanni, our project manager who keeps things moving along!

Another highlight of the year for me has been the continued increase in the service to the community, under the guidance of Judyth Foley, our Outreach Chairperson. We have been feeding people over the holidays and bringing joy to children and families who don't have the financial blessings that many of us enjoy. We have fed families and delivered gifts to single mothers and children. I am so impressed by our congregation's generosity to struggling families on the south shore! I am also looking forward to the new ways in which God's Spirit leads us in sharing aloha with everyone!

A final highlight for me has been the increased attendance and involvement of young families to our church. The children's Christmas program this year was one of the best I've ever seen in over 30 years of ministry in churches! I am especially grateful for Tiffany Marrotte and all of the adults and teenagers who volunteer with our children. I am also grateful for all of our members who welcome the children, teenagers and their families into the life of our church. It is so important that we have a place for young people to come, hear and learn about God's love which is for all people!

Thank you to everyone for making 2017 such a wonderful year. I am eager to see the good things that God has in store for us in the year to come, and especially glad that I get to spend it with all of you!



HISTORIC HAWAII FOUNDATION
