# A NOTE FROM KAHU AKANA

Dear Members and Friends of Koloa Union Church:

When I arrived in Koloa in February of 2014, I was told by one of our Council members that the beautiful old tamarind tree in the back yard of the Smith Memorial Parsonage had to be cut down. The church had asked a tree expert his opinion on the tree and the recommendation was to cut it down. Since I love big trees, I suggested we ask three additional "tree experts" for their opinion. They all looked at the tree, pointed out major rot throughout the trunk and suggested it be cut down. They showed me that I could stick my entire arm in one side of the tree, reach as far as I could and not touch the other side of the tree. The majority of the trunk had rotted away to almost nothing. They told me: "If you don't cut it down, it will fall down, and there's a good chance it will fall on the parsonage." When I told the final tree expert who visited the parsonage that I really wished there was some way to save the tree, he said something like this: "Trees are like any other living organism; they don't live forever. Just like people, a tree's life eventually comes to an end." The Council decided to take down the tree, and I agreed with the decision.

When the tree was cut down, I was surprised by how sad I felt—even though I believed it was the right thing to do and I knew the life of the tree was coming to an end whether we cut it down or wait a few more years and risk significant damage to the parsonage. It was kind of like attending the funeral of a loved one. As saws cut into the tree, it was as if they were sawing at my own soul. With time, I have adjusted to the loss of the tamarind tree.



There are two things that made the loss more bearable. I read that Queen Emma, when she was living on Kaua`i in the 19<sup>th</sup> century, visited the home of Dr. James Smith and was quite impressed with the tamarind tree on his property. The good doctor gave her a couple of seedlings to

plant at her home in Lawai Valley—now Allerton Gardens, part of National Tropical Botanical Gardens. I had the opportunity to take a tour of the gardens, and the tour guide pointed out the tamarinds and said, "Queen Emma herself had theses planted right here." I almost shouted, "She got those from my backyard!" (I resisted, however, and let the tour guide finish his talk.)

And then...a man by the name of Robin Clark showed up at the church a couple weeks ago carrying a bowl made of tamarind. He told me that he got the wood from the tree in my backyard. Just before the tree came down, I put the word out to the wood workers on the island that there was free tamarind for the taking. Robin told me that he salvaged a whole bunch of tamarind from our tree and wanted to give me a bowl in appreciation for all the free wood. What a special gift that I will cherish forever!

The bowl reminded me this week of the story of Easter. Resurrection follows death. New life follows loss. Beauty follows destruction. Joy follows sadness. I hope each of you has the opportunity to see this bowl. When you do, may it remind you of the message of Easter. I know it will always remind me of it!
