A NOTE FROM KAHU AKANA

“A NEW VISION, NEW OPPORTUNITIES”

As we enter the fall season, it is time once again to reflect on our blessings and consider what God might be leading us to do in the coming year. During the month of September, we will be reflecting in particular on what the upcoming year might look like. I have been working with Virginia Dunas and Rosemary Smythe—Stewardship Committee Co-chairs—in determining a theme for 2019, and we decided to focus on gratitude, welcoming and sharing; we came up with this tagline for the year ahead of us:

“With gratitude, welcoming all and sharing our blessings”

After reflecting on this theme for the month of September, I invite you to join me in bringing your 2019 commitment cards to church with you (they will be mailed soon) on September 30th. Please prayerfully consider what amount you might commit to that truly represents your gratitude for all Kōloa Union Church gives to you and our community. We will ask God’s blessing upon our commitments during the worship service on that day and then celebrate during an extended Aloha Hour with a special meal and talent show. Please consider participating in the talent show, and bring friends and neighbors.

Over the summer, our Deacons and Council members have been reflecting and imagining even beyond 2019; we have been working together on a new vision statement for the next three years. After coming up with ideas and priorities together during a day-long retreat, the Deacons and Council have both spent time

separately talking about a new vision for our church. It is now time to share it with the congregation. Keep in mind that it is still in draft form so that church members and friends have time to reflect and respond to me or the Church Council before it is approved later in the fall. As you read the statement, remember that a vision statement is to provide focus and energy to where we are heading, but not to include everything that we plan to do during the next three years; and it is not to restrict us or hold us back from our dreams or from using our gifts.

In September 2021, Kōloa Union Church is an Open & Affirming Church of the United Church of Christ, and people in our community know that truly all individuals are welcome here without judgment or condemnation. The celebration and love of our diversity unites us.

We are overflowing onto the picnic table area outside.

Moore Hall is a very attractive and inviting space.

We have created an attractive, peaceful, safe and useful space on the west end of our property.

A large covering allows people to comfortably eat, play, attend live performances and hear everything happening in the sanctuary.

Our members and guests give generously and joyfully to the general fund and special funds. We no longer depend on borrowing from our permanent funds in order to cover our normal expenses.

The purpose of our ministry is to promote an active prayer life among our group members; to facilitate spiritual formation in each of us; to strengthen bonds of Christian love, friendship, fellowship among members; to involve as many people as possible in our prayer efforts. We make prayer quilts and squares as a tangible sign of love and our interior work of prayer. A request must be made for a Prayer Quilt and you must check with the intended recipient or a family member before you give the gift of a quilt; surprises are not appropriate. Ask if the person to receive the quilt will accept your gift of prayer. Ask what they would like you to pray for. Ask what information about their situation may be shared. Prayer Quilts in our ministry are made **for members of our congregation and/or immediate family members**. Special circumstances apply. Please speak to one of the group members.
